1. Wrong Conclusion (13)

 "I am being tempted by God" -Charge: "It's your fault, God! You put me in this situation." -God is only good and does only good

1. Wrong Conclusion (13)

 "I am being tempted by God" -God tests us to strengthen and mature us (Gen. 22) -We are blessed when we endure under the trial

1. Wrong Conclusion (13)

 Why do we fail the tests? Because we listen to the ...

• Each one is tempted by his own lust -Lust: strong desire or craving •Some bad, some good Problems: inordinate? Ungodly strategies? Ungodly response?

The Story of Manna

 Paul told the Corinthians to learn from Israel's mistakes: do not desire wrong things but endure through the tests (1 Cor. 10:1-13)

• Each one is tempted by his own lust -Trials highlight any conflict between our desires and God's -We fail the tests when we obey our desires instead of God's

• Each one is tempted by his own lust -In the midst of trials we are to bear up under (i.e. – endure) the test / temptation and be faithful to what God has said (be *doers* – 1:25)

Do not be deceived (*led astray*)

 –What you *believe* determines how you *perceive* (e.g. – 1:3)
 –... and how you live

 Every act of giving which is good and every gift which is complete ...

Addresses the nature of the Giver and the value of the gifts given
God gives good; sin brings death

- Every act of giving which is good and every gift which is complete ...
 - -Gifts = maturity (4), wisdom (5)
 - -Therefore, receive trials with joy!

- [continually] coming down from the Father of [the] lights
 - -Gen. 1:14-19; Ps. 8:3

- [continually] *coming down from the Father of* [the] *lights*
 - —The God who created the universe is the same God Who gives these good gifts, on a continual basis

- with whom there is no variation or shifting shadow
 - -God doesn't change! (Immutable)

• Mal. 3:6; Rom. 4:20-25

-God is consistently only good

3. Right Theology (17-18) • Do we determine what good means? -Good = pleasant, agreeable? • Rom. 5:1-5 -Tribulation \rightarrow perseverance \rightarrow

proven character (maturity) → hope

- God's good: maturity, character
 —Exult! Rejoice! Consider it joy!
- How might this affect how we pray?
- How does all of this affect our view of 'spiritual warfare'?

 Worldly wisdom: "I act this way because of what happened to me." —In other words, "It's God's fault."

 Godly wisdom: These circumstances expose who you are and what you believe, and offer help to grow
 —Matt. 14:22-33

-Context: 13:1-16:20 (Mark 6-8)

3. Right Theology (17-18) • In the exercise of His will He brought us forth by the word of truth -Salvation is an act of God's will -The simple gospel, empowered by the Holy Spirit (Rom. 10:17)

3. Right Theology (17-18) • In the exercise of His will He brought us forth by the word of truth -If the *always* and *only good* God

willed us to be *saved* from sin, why would He then *tempt* us to sin?

- so that we would be a kind of <u>first</u> <u>fruits</u> among His creatures
 - -Of converts? (1 Cor. 16:15) -Of creation? (Rom. 8:19-22)

So What?

 Adopt the right perspective on trials -They come from a good God -They are good (not nec. pleasant) -They are for our good (instruct, discipline, mature)-Heb. 12:11

So What?

- God's glory is more important than our physical well-being -Acts 21:7-14
- God is more concerned with the
 - spiritual than physical -Heb. 11:36-38
- God uses physical circumstances to teach spiritual lessons -2 Cor. 12:7-10

So What?

- What is God trying to teach you?
- Take God at His word and act on it (faith – Heb. 11)
- Be faithful to the faithful God—He is growing you (Rom. 5:3-5)
