Mark 6:1-29 **Lessons for Ministry:** 1. You May Face Rejection 2. You Can Trust God 3. You May Lose Your Head



You May Face Rejection Back to Nazareth •Did He visit twice? •First Visit: Matt. 4:12-13; Luke 4:16-30 After His temptation and John's arrest He taught in the synagogue They tried to kill Him

You May Face Rejection Back to Nazareth •Second Visit: Matt. 13:53-58; Mark 6:1-6 This time He had disciples Second chance for Nazareth? Prepare the disciples for their ministry? (see 6:11)

You May Face Rejection Jesus taught in the synagogue •Many listeners were astonished [as in a blow to the head] But they didn't believe it or the miracles •They ask: "Who is this guy?" •Or rather: "Who does He think He is?"

You May Face Rejection • "Where did this guy get these things?" •He's just a carpenter! •He's the son of Mary! His brothers and sisters aren't anything special

You May Face Rejection They took offense at Him •From bait stick or the trigger of a trap •To cause to be ensnared; to stumble •Rom. 9:32-33; 1 Cor. 1:23 By rejecting Him they ensnared themselves in unbelief

You May Face Rejection •The result: He could do no miracle there (5) •He did not do ... - Matt. 13:58 This was both judgment and mercy •Cf. Matt. 11:20-24 •He wondered at their unbelief He didn't take it personally

You Can Trust God •He was going around the villages in a circle teaching (6b) Itinerant preaching around Galilee (cf. Matt. 4:23; 9:35) •Was Jesus alone? •He summoned the disciples (7)

You Can Trust God •Jesus sent the disciples out in pairs (cf. Matt. 10:2-4) •He gave them authority: Over unclean spirits • [To heal every kind of disease/sickness] (see 13; Matt. 10:1; Luke 9:1)

You Can Trust God •Jesus sent the disciples out in pairs (cf. Matt. 10:2-4) •He gave them instructions: Trust God for everything •Stay in one place Pass judgment on those who reject You Can Trust God They went out and preached that men should repent (see 1:15) •To relent, change the mind [be converted] True sorrow for unbelief and change of thought resulting in change of action This is God's message to all men (Acts) 17:30-31; cf. Luke 13:1-5)

You Can Trust God They were casting out demons and healing God was confirming them as Jesus' ambassadors (cf. Heb. 2:1-4; 2 Cor. 12:12) Jesus' works were apologetic (John 10:25, 37-38; 14:10-12)

You May Lose Your Head King Herod wanted to know what was going on ("Who is He?") John the Baptist has risen from the dead •Elijah •A prophet

You May Lose Your Head John called Herod to repentance (18) Herodius wanted to kill John (19) Herod had John imprisoned (17) John didn't compromise his message Herod was perplexed - battle between conscience and will

So What? •Lessons for Ministry: Sometimes people don't want to hear what God wants you to say Sometimes they respond poorly But that should not change our message ("Repent!")

So What? •Lessons for Ministry: Sometimes people will use any excuse to discount your message Lack of credentials, unpublished, "you're just one of us" Familiarity breeds contempt

So What? •Lessons for Ministry: It doesn't always go the way you want Sometime people don't change Sometimes disciples lose their lives •Mark 8:34-38 •We have hope for the future
