His Thanks to Christ (12-17)
 His Charge to Timothy (18-20)



**His Thanks to Christ** A. For His Ministry (12) The fact that he had been entrusted with the gospel prompted him to express thanks to Christ (1:11) 1. Strength – the ability to perform the task assigned to him (Phil. 4:13; cf. Eph. 1:19; 6:10; Col. 1:9-12)

#### His Thanks to Christ

- A. For His Ministry (12)
  - 2. <u>Stewardship</u> Jesus trusted and entrusted him (1 Cor. 4:1-2; 7:25)
  - Service his ministry as an apostle to the gentiles (1:1; Acts 20:24; 21:19; Rom. 11:13; 2 Cor. 5:18-20; Col. 1:23-25)

**His Thanks to Christ** B. For His Mercy •Past (13a) – formerly: •Blasphemer – verbal abuse, slander (yet see Acts 26:11) Persecutor – physical violence (Acts) 22:4-5; Gal. 1:13)

**His Thanks to Christ B.** For His Mercy •Past (13a) – formerly: Violent aggressor – "arrogant sadism;" a bully inflicting violence for pleasure (Acts 26:9-11)

**His Thanks to Christ** B. For His Mercy •Past (13b) – yet: "Because I acted ignorantly in unbelief" Paul thought he was serving God! (Acts 22:3; 26:4-5; Gal. 1:13-14) •But then he learned the good news the message of truth (Eph. 1:13)

**His Thanks to Christ B.** For His Mercy •Past (14) – and: He was saved by superabounding grace (Rom. 5:20-21; Eph. 2:8-9) •He found faith and love in Christ (1:5; cf Gal. 5:6; Eph. 1:15; 3:17; Col. 1:4)

**His Thanks to Christ B.** For His Mercy •Purpose (16) •An example: "If Christ could save me, He can save anyone!" •Demonstrate His longsuffering – forbearance under provocation, waiting for repentance (2 Pet. 3:9)

**His Thanks to Christ B.** For His Mercy •Purpose (15) Because Jesus came to save sinners "It is a trustworthy statement" – a maxim demanding assent (see 3:1; 4:9; 2 Tim. 2:11; Titus 3:8) This is sound doctrine

**His Thanks to Christ B.** For His Mercy •Purpose (15) Because Jesus came to save sinners "Among who I am foremost of all" •Am, not was (i.e. - a saved sinner) •Foremost – rank; head of the line (1 Cor. 15:9; Eph. 3:8; cf. Luke 7:40-47)

**His Thanks to Christ** B. For His Mercy •Praise (17; see also 6:15-16) •King of the ages – sovereign over all time and space Immortal – incorruptible; unchanging Invisible – distinct from creation •The only God – there is no other

**His Thanks to Christ B.** For His Mercy •Praise (17; see also 6:15-16) To Him be honor and glory forever! •"... we exist to glorify God" •That's all that matters (Phil. 1:20; cf. Acts 20:22-24; 21:10-14)

**His Charge to Timothy** •Charge: remain & instruct (see 3-4) •In accordance with the prophecies •Like Acts 13:1-3? •War the good warfare (see 6:12) •Timothy was engaged in spiritual warfare (see 2 Cor. 10:3-6; Eph. 6:17)

**His Charge to Timothy** According to 2 Cor. 10:3-6... •Where is the battlefield? The human mind (heart) •What are the targets? Corrupt thinking and feelings/passions that are not in line with God's revealed truth

**His Charge to Timothy** •Charge: remain & instruct (see 3-4) •War the good warfare (see 6:12) •The weapons are sound doctrine from the revealed gospel (1:10-11), i.e. truth of/about God (Word of God -Eph. 6:17)

**His Charge to Timothy** •Charge: remain & instruct (see 3-4) •Keeping faith and a good conscience Holding to apostolic truth (the faith) Maintaining a clear conscience (obey) Your conscience holds you to what you believe to be true (cf. Rom. 14) It is important to know the truth!

**His Charge to Timothy** •Charge: remain & instruct (see 3-4) Keeping faith and a good conscience •Which some have rejected (see 4:2) •Hymenaeus (2 Tim. 2:16-19) •Alexander? (2 Tim. 4:14; Acts 19:33)? And suffered shipwreck – when God's truth is rejected, disaster follows

**His Charge to Timothy** •Charge: remain & instruct (see 3-4) Re: Hymenaeus and Alexander Whom I have handed over to Satan Excommunication, chastisement (see 1 Cor. 5:1-5) To teach them not to blaspheme (teach false doctrine? 2 Tim. 2:16-19)

## So What? We should remember our past •But focus on God's redemption •"I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery." (Ex. 20:2) • "But God ... even when we were dead ... made us alive ... " (Eph. 2:1-10)

### So What? We should remember our past is •But focus on God's redemption "For I am the Lord who brought you up from the land of Egypt to be your God; thus you shall be holy, for I am holy." (Lev. 11:45) •1 Pet. 1:13-2:3

# So What? We should remember our past •But focus on God's redemption •"Yeah, but it's bad for our self-esteem" •But it's great for our God-esteem! (17) •Eph. 1:3-14 (to the praise of His glory) •1 Pet. 2:9-12; cf. Col. 1:12-23 •1 Cor. 6:9-11
