

2. Understanding False Teachers (4-5)

- 1. Recognizing False Teachers
- ·How do we know them?
 - A. By What They Affirm
 - They advocate a different doctrine
 - •Different from the apostles' teachings (e.g.- 2:1—6:2; cf. 2 Pet. 3:1-2)
 - •Timothy was to instruct certain men not to teach such things (1:3)

- 1. Recognizing False Teachers
- •How do we know them?
 - B. By What They *Deny*
 - They do not agree with sound words
 - •Sound = Healthy promoting spiritual health (cf. 1:10)
 - •Cf. <u>nourished</u> on the words of the faith and the good doctrine (4:6)

- 1. Recognizing False Teachers
- •How do we know them?
 - B. By What They *Deny*
 - They do not agree with words of our Lord Jesus Christ (Regarding? Spoken by?)
 - From Jesus, through His apostles (1 Cor. 14:37; Gal. 1:11-12; 2 Thess. 3:6; 2 Pet. 3:1-2; cf. 1 John 2:7-8)

- 1. Recognizing False Teachers
- •How do we know them?
 - B. By What They *Deny*
 - •They do not agree with the doctrine conforming to godliness (4:7-10; 6:11)
 - •l.e. teaching that outlines Godly living (cf. 1 Thess. 4:1-12)

- 2. Understanding False Teachers
- Characteristics of false teachers:
 - They tell only half the story
 - •Over-emphasize what we get: freedom, forgiveness, gifts from God, etc.
 - •Overlook what we are to do with what we have been given: love, give, serve, good deeds, etc.

2. Understanding False Teachers

- •For example:
 - •"It was for <u>freedom</u> that Christ set us free" (Gal. 5:1a)
 - •"For you were called to freedom, brethren; only do not turn your freedom into an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another." (Gal. 5:13)

- 2. Understanding False Teachers
- Characteristics of false teachers:
 - •Appeal to the flesh (2 Pet. 2:18-19)
 - •Misuse grace / freedom (Jude 4, 16)
 - •Twist God's word (2 Tim. 2:14-19)
 - Appear orthodox (2 Cor. 11:13-15)
 - Motivated by greed (2 Pet. 2:3, 13)

- 2. Understanding False Teachers
- A. They are conceited
 - •Blinded by smoke (see 3:6)
 - •He has placed himself above God's word and judges it (cf. James 4:11-12)
 - •We should humbly submit to it (Matt. 7:24-27; Luke 11:28; cf. James 1:22-25)

- 2. Understanding False Teachers
- B. They understand nothing
 - •Or: he has become conceited while understanding nothing
 - Baseless pride
 - •Rejection of God's word brings ignorance blindness, judgment, etc. (Eph. 4:17-19; Mark 4:11-12; John 12:44-50)



- 2. Understanding False Teachers
- C. They are sick
 - An unhealthy obsession with:
 - Controversial questions: (philosophical) speculations with no answers or purpose
 - Disputes about words: trifling over insignificant differences (2 Tim. 2:14-15)

- 2. Understanding False Teachers
- D. They produce works of the flesh
 - •Envy ill-will due to the excellence, happiness, or success of another
 - •Strife wrangling, contention
 - Abusive language slander, insults
 - Evil suspicions judging another's motives
 - Constant friction irritability

- 2. Understanding False Teachers
- D. They produce works of the flesh
 - •See Rom. 1:28-32; Gal. 5:19-21;
 - Col. 3:8; cf. James 3:14-16
 - Acting out when desires not fulfilled (see James 4:1-10)

- 2. Understanding False Teachers
- E. They have corrupted minds
 - The mind is designed to comprehend truth and inform the will
 - The mind that rejects God's truth will cease to function properly
 - Hate the truth; love the lie (Rom. 1:18-32; Eph. 4:17-19; cf. 2 Thess. 2:9-12)

- 2. Understanding False Teachers
- E. They are deprived of the truth
 - •Better: bereft they were once exposed to truth but have turned away (1:19; 4:1; cf. Mark 4:24-25; Titus 1:14)
 - •They even oppose the truth (2 Tim. 3:8)
 - •Dangerous! (Heb. 10:26-31)
- F. They are greedy (next week)

• False teachers emphasize self; God desires love & good deeds



- Created for good works (Eph. 2:10)
- "and let us consider how to stimulate one another to love and good deeds" (Heb. 10:24)

- You have been given to give; use what you have been given
 - "Freely you received, freely give." (Matt. 10:8)
 - •"Be kind to one another, tender-hearted, forgiving each other, just as God in Christ also has forgiven you." (Eph. 4:32)

- The Truth is important to God!
 - •The truth sets us free (John 8:32)
 - We must know sound doctrine
 - We must live out sound doctrine
 - •This is how we know that we have come to know Him (1 John 2:3-5)

- Are we false teachers if we don't know everything perfectly?!
 - ·No, we cannot know everything perfectly
 - •But we are expected to grow in knowledge (1 Pet. 3:18; cf. 1 Pet. 1:3-11)
 - •Speak the truth to one another, to promote maturity (Eph. 4:15)
